## Ocean Facts · The Test

- The average ocean depth is 2.65 miles or 14,000 feet!
- The deepest part of the ocean is called the Challenger Deep and is located beneath the western Pacific Ocean in the southern end of the Mariana Trench, which runs several hundred kilometers southwest of the U.S. territorial island of Guam. Challenger Deep is approximately 36,200 feet deep (over 6 miles). It is named after the British survey ship Challenger II, which first surveyed the trench in 1951.
- The world's five oceans, ranging from the largest to smallest are the Pacific, the Atlantic, the Indian, the Antarctic, and the Arctic.
- Over 1 million known species of plants and animals live in the ocean, and scientists say there may be as many as 9 million species we haven't discovered yet. Whoa!
